Together with donors, the Foundation works to enhance all areas of life including, but not limited to, education, environment, civic and human services, health care and the arts.

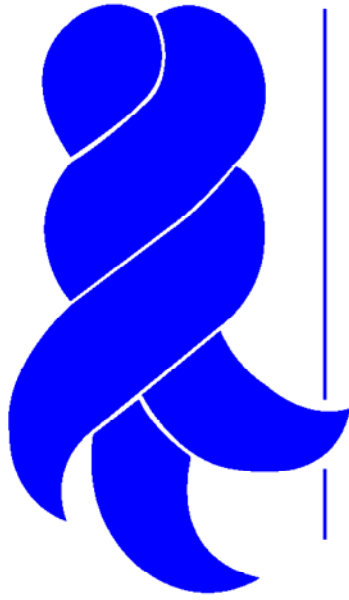
HOW DOES THE FOUNDATION WORK WITH LOCAL CHARITIES?
