Record Breaking Match Month Benefits 14 Local Nonprofits and Community Enhancement Fund

FEATURE

Thanks to the generosity of our donors and a partnership with the Patterson Family Foundation, together we had a record breaking match month raising over \$42,200 for local nonprofit endowed funds held at Smoky Valley Community Foundation.

The monies raised were matched by \$4,000 from SVCF and \$38,620 from the Patterson Family Foundation, resulting in a total community impact of \$84,820. Donations to the Smoky Valley Community Enhancement Fund were matched at 200% up to \$4,000, and nonprofit funds were matched at 100% up to \$5,000. Because these monies are permanently endowed, they will be here forever to support

the Smoky Valley area and its nonprofits.

The Patterson Family Foundation is a family-led, private foundation continuing the legacy of Neal and Jeanne Patterson whose mission is advancing health care, education, and strengthening communities especially in rural areas in Kansas and western Missouri. They understand that local community foundations play a special role in serving their communities and hope to inspire more local donors to participate in rural philanthropy thorugh rural serving community foundations, and for more donations to flow to local nonprofits as a result.

Smoky Valley Community Enhancement Fund-\$3,000

Bethany College students got the chance to participate in a performance with the Chamber Orchestra of Smoky Valley (COSV). COSV is the only fully professional chamber orchestra in the region, drawing members from Salina, Wichita, Hutchinson, Manhattan and Kansas City. Grant dollars were used towards facilities and stipends for musicians.



Over \$87,000 was granted to 15 nonprofit organizations to support their missions and preserve our rural way of life. These grants are distributed annually from funds held at SVCF on behalf of our donors and generous people like you who are helping plant our future!

WHAT TO GIVE OTHER THAN CASH

There are many ways to give to the community foundation besides cash including appreciated stocks and securities, retirement accounts, real estate, grain and even cryptocurrency!

Depending on your financial situation, these could be a more tax efficient way to give back to your community and should be discussed with your financial advisor.

Whatever you choose, we want to partner with you to help "plant our future," and grow Smoky Valley!



APPRECIATED STOCKS & SECURITIES

- Avoid long-term capital gains tax by donating appreciated stocks or securities that you have owned for over a year.
- Receive a charitable income tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the security.
- Examples include gifts of stock, bonds, and business interests.



RETIREMENT ACCOUNT

- Include the Foundation as a beneficiary of your retirement account. We receive the full amount and pay zero income tax, getting the entire benefit of your gift!
- If you are 70 1/2 or older you can contribute up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to the Foundation (except for donor advised funds) and avoid paying income taxes on the distribution.



REAL ESTATE

- Avoid paying capital gains tax on the sale of the real estate.
- Receive a charitable income tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the property.
- All gifts of real estate are liquidated with the proceeds of the sale going to the fund of your choice.



GRAIN

- Transfer and donate the grain to the Foundation's account at the grain elevator and the Foundation sells it with proceeds going into the fund of your choice.
- Avoid income tax on the donated grain.
- Deduct the production cost of the donated grain if applicable.



CRYPTOCURRENCY

- Donate your cryptocurrency using The Giving Block platform on our website.
- Avoid capital gains tax on appreciated cryptocurrency held for at least one year.
- Receive a charitable income tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the cryptocurrency.
